IF YOU PLAN ON CAMPING IN OREGON NATIONAL FORESTS & WILDERNESS AREAS THIS SUMMER...

If you are, then you need to take **CERTIFIED WEED FREE HAY** to feed as it's required for your animals in these areas as well as USFS & BLM Lands. The Forest Service can ticket you if they find you with non-certified hay.

The Standlee compressed 50lb bales of timothy grass can be used & it's found at Coastal Farms in White City and at Raineys Corner Market/Feed. Raineys also sells "Packer Pellets" that can be fed. It's advisable to call ahead to make sure it's available at either stores.

Lily Glen Horse Park is Open Now for the Camping Season & Riding the Trails!

Daily Parking Fee - \$4.00 per vehicle w/horse

(Season Passes are sold at the JC Parks Office for \$45)

Campsites are \$22/night (includes 1 vehicle)

Maximum of 8 people per campsite.

Maximum Stay Limit at ALL Jackson County Parks: 14 days out of any 30-day period

Additional Vehicles (limit one) are \$6/night.

Weed Free Hay is not required in Jackson County Parks.

Sabina thanked Val Hackett for bringing refreshments and to Debbie Smith & the Club for furnishing the door prizes.

Introduction of New Members/Guests- Welcomed returning club member Victoria Hanhart, she has a 28 year old Arab & a 16 year old Mustang she does Gymkhanas with.

JCHA Event Planning-

End of Summer Lingo/Poker Ride, Sept 9th, Willow Prairie Horse Camp & Day Use Area—Karen House reported there is need for club volunteers for poker dealers, help at the registration table and potluck. The flagged trail route on the designated trails will be done Friday September 8th. On the day of the ride first rider out at 10:00am, last rider out at 11:00am. We'll have a potluck around 2pm. TATA Trot Horse Show & Trail Horse Show, Oct 7th-8th, The Expo- Chairman Sabina Martin announced that Jami Kaptein is judge this year for the horse show on Saturday, judging classes and the infamous TATA Trot class and the costume classes. For the trail horse show on Sunday, there will be 3-4 judges per 3 obstacles, different trail courses for the different age classes. Old Business-

Recap of the Willow Prairie Horse Camp Work Party May 20th -

Shirley Wade attended and she reported that work was done cleaning roadways of debris, around camp, chewed and rotten corral rails were replaced, water troughs were cleaned. Shirley also mentioned there is no potable water so you'll need to bring your own drinking water, there's water in the troughs for livestock. Judy Klein is camp host again this year.

New Business-

Donated Water Trough for Willow Prairie Horse Camp-

The USFS water trough in front of camp sight #10 was damaged by a falling tree approximately 2 years ago and needs replacing. Info was relayed from Debbie Walker asking the club if we would like to donate a galvanized stock tank to replace the damaged one, Scot Beemer of the Forest Service would install it. Funds from the Joann Poole Fund would be used to purchase the tank.

Since member attendance was low at this meeting President Sabina Martin suggested it be tabled and discuss it again at the July membership meeting.

Wildcat Horse Camp-

President Sabina Martin was up at this BLM horse camp up by Hyatt Lake last weekend to check it out and she found a lot of construction is currently being done, so she thought maybe JCHA could help out, such as volunteer hours and more to assist in getting the camp open. The horse camp currently has 5 camp sites with corrals and is close to the lake with access to the PCT, there's a huge bridge to walk over with a large water fall next to it, ride down to the lodge where there's tie rails to tie your horse and go have lunch. Sabina will look into contacting someone for further info and report her findings at the next membership meeting.

Other Events— Welcome Ranch is having an Obstacle Trail Course Show this coming weekend 6/17/2023. Julliana Evans announced the Brushriders are thinking about hosting a Cow Clinic at one of the local stock yards, the date is to be determined, also another obstacle show at a later date.
