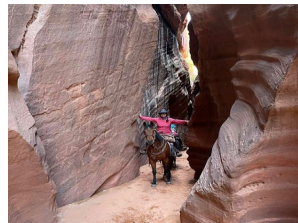

Roll call of Board- Was completed with President, Sabina Martin, Vice President, Debbie Walker, Treasurer, Bruce House, Secretary, Karen House, Sunshine, Carol Dombrowsky, Hospitality, Sandi Humphres, and Member at Large, Julieana Evans.

Refreshments & Door Prize- Thanks went to Karen House, Debbie Walker, Carol Dombrowsky, Laura Woolley and Michelle Morton for refreshments and to Judy Klein, Don Shearer, Michelle Morton and the club for furnishing the door prizes.

Introduction of New Members and Guests- This months guest was Kaiana Wellbaum, granddaughter of Penny Boggs.

July Minutes- There were no corrections or additions to the newsletter. Motion was made and 2nd to accept the July minutes as printed in the newsletter, the motion was passed.

Treasurer's Report- Bruce House reported the club had a beginning balance in the checking account- \$3,761.57; expenses \$1,967.96; income \$1,206.00. Ending balance in checking \$2,999.61 ; Joann Pool fund \$4,282.39; cash on hand \$25.00; Business Ownership Account \$8.33; for total cash assets of \$7,315.33. No outstanding club related bills to hand in. Motion was made, 2nd and approved to accept the treasurer report.

Sunshine Report- Carol Dombrowsky reported that she sent cards to Dianne Gorman for the loss of her horse, Amanda Anderson for an accident she recently had and to Sassy Walker (Debbie Walkers dog) for being sick.

Ride JCHA Report- Karen House described the award program to the membership then announced two awards this month presenting to Victoria Hanhart for her 100 hours award level, she received a 100 hour bar patch and first aid kit then to Leann Quint who reached her 4,000 hours award level. She received a 4,000 hour bar patch and a \$40.00 gift card from Coastal.

JCHA Event Planning:

TATA Trot Horse Show & Trail Challenge- Oct 7-8: Sabina Martin is chairing this event and needs help in this two day horse show and trail challenge! The shows will be at the Jackson County Expo, in the Krause and Barker barns. There's need of help at both events: judges, sign up desk, gates & more! Plus we need sponsors for high points & classes, donations are gladly accepted. For the trail challenge, Sabina has 3 different bridges, a water box and more to make for 16 different obstacles. There will be a warm up area. For those who want to reserve stalls during the shows, they will need to contact the Expo, rates are \$25.00 per night.
